| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Partner with government; stop fighting with them</li> <li>• Lack of candor about AIDS is a major vulnerability</li> <li>• Offer rapid testing with orientations for prevention with the objective of knowing the early sociological status</li> <li>• Disparities in funding for NGOs made worse by lack of coordination – funding comes from private companies and with limited government funding</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Work with NGOs to change perspectives and practice</li> <li>• Political support for officials who support AIDS</li> <li>• Organize PWA/PLWA as interest groups</li> <li>• Private Sector</li> <li>• Churches, religious leaders</li> <li>• Panama Ras a council committee by law (churches are representatives)</li> <li>• Guadalajara – WAY TO LIFE (created by project) HIV/AIDS</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Gave boys and girls legal work and opportunity to earn money to discourage them from becoming sex workers – opportunities to participate in society</li> <li>• Early EU epidemic NGOs made a huge effort to influence government</li> <li>• Partnerships with private sector and medicine</li> <li>• Make agreements/partnerships with all levels of government about how to understand the problem</li> <li>• Train leaders of the community to education the city about HIV/AIDS</li> </ul> |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use networks to coordinate national priorities and local efforts</li> </ul>  | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Most Latin American countries do this</li> <li>• Link AIDS to community development efforts at inclusivity</li> </ul>   | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Outreach to religious leaders</li> <li>• Work with health professionals to sensitize them to stigma and needs so PWA/PWLA will have confidence in them and disclose themselves</li> <li>• Panama – established by law consensus mechanism so PLWA and agreement NGOs gather, churches included, an alliance</li> </ul>  |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Public marketing to increase support, prevention and use of services that are available</li> <li>• Increase access to general health services (people at risk)</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• POL program at CDC</li> <li>• Brazil outreach to sex workers</li> <li>• Animals as examples</li> <li>• Work with the media to tell stories and get the word out</li> <li>• Brazil AO campaign</li> <li>• Have coordinated efforts to care amongst all providers/ NGOs</li> <li>• Economics of scale</li> <li>• Educate people about rights and resources</li> <li>• Mobile van health clinic</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Media not really interested in AIDS, doesn't sell newspapers or TV</li> <li>• Guadalupe, NGO works on spiritual issues, have support of priests, respect other beliefs, respect, do not judge, support communities</li> <li>• It is not just the Catholic church that complicates the discussion</li> <li>• Way to Life, founded by priest, works in human rights of people living with HIV/AIDS</li> <li>• El Salvador, church involved in education and visits with PLWA to sensitize them to the issue</li> <li>• Ad campaign to teach women how to ask for a condom, focus on self efficacy</li> <li>• Free condoms in highly visible area in Brazil, not acceptable in U.S.</li> <li>• Australia, public bathrooms vend condoms and needles</li> </ul> |
